





Veteran's Memorial Park

In the heart of historic downtown Liberty, a city founded by veterans of the American Revolution and home to many who have served their country to present day, is Veterans Memorial Park, a tribute to those sacrificed to preserve our freedoms with individual stones to commemorate each local veteran. Whether you have ties to the community or enjoy local history, you'll appreciate this unique memorial, located at the intersection of KY 49 and Hustonville Street.


The Liberty Bell

Next to Veteran's Memorial Park, you can see an exact replica of the Liberty Bell. Like the original that arrived in Philadelphia in 1753, it was cast by the Whitechapel Bell Foundry of London, England. The bell measures 47 inches in diameter and is 45 inches tall. Made of "bell bronze," a special tin and copper alloy, the bell weighs approximately 2,700 lbs. The headstock is crafted from African Teak.



Lake Liberty

Excellent water quality and natural habitat make this 88-acre, man-made lake an excellent spot for fishing and trolling. It's a perfect place to bring your canoe or kayak, but personal jet-driven or combustion-propelled watercraft are not allowed. *Swimming is not permitted.*



To fish at Lake Liberty, non-senior adults need a \$10-per-family permit, in addition to a valid Kentucky fishing license. Open seven days a week from 6 am to midnight, Lake Liberty is off KY70, on KY817. Call Liberty City Hall, 606-787-0000, to obtain a permit; get details at the Website of the Kentucky Dept. of Fish and Wildlife Resources: <http://fw.ky.gov>.
